"Let us go across to the other side." – Jesus invites us, his disciples, on a journey to the other side. It is not just a journey through the space; rather it is a journey through meaning. A journey necessary for our families, for our parish, for all of us! We are so often very limited in our thinking. We tend to think about everything from our perspective, using our point of view, our categories, our concept of what is right and wrong.

Jesus invites us to go to the other side. It means he invites us to listen to the point of view of the other person: what does he or she think? What is in his or her heart? What causes the person to behave in such or other



In order to be able to go to the other side we have to "leave the crowd behind". We have to abandon the standard ways of thinking, the ways they all do, the patterns imposed on us by the society, the learned behaviours. We can no more follow the crowd. Instead we have to invite Jesus to our boat.

The journey is not easy. There will be storms to face. "Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?" We will cry out similar words very often! From our perspective all seems to be very dramatic, but God knows what He is doing. Jesus is sleeping, peacefully. He trusts his Father. "He woke up, rebuked the wind, and said to the sea: Peace! Be still! The wind ceased, and there was a dead calm."

Why are you afraid? Have you still no faith?" Do and believe! Try and have trust! Listen in order to understand! Pray so that you may have compassion! That's all God wants you to do so that you can go across to the other side, so that you may understand the heart of the other, so that you may see everything from God's perspective, so that you may witness God's mighty works!
