The words of Jesus about riches scared the Apostles. Jesus seeing their reaction clarifies that it's not about wealth as such but about our attitude towards it. Our riches can be an obstacle on our way to the Kingdom of God if they occupy the central place in our lives and we put our trust in them hoping that they suffice to reach the fullness of our lives. After Jesus' explanation the Apostles were even more astonished, because for them prosperity always had been a sign of God's blessing. Jesus instead suggests that sometimes we have to renounce material wealth in order to obtain higher values.



A good example of such situation is the Gospel story of a young rich man who, despite being a just man who obeys God's commandments, longs for something more and that's why he asks: "What must I do to inherit eternal life?" Jesus answers: "Go, sell what you have, and give to the poor and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me." But the young rich went away sad, for he had many possessions. He is not able to renounce them. He doesn't follow Jesus, he doesn't follow His perfect life, for his possessions are for him a great obstacle. He goes away sad, unhappy...

Our possessions can make us more selfish, more self-centered, closing thus the doors of God's Kingdom. It doesn't refer only to money, material possessions, but also qualities like intelligence, knowledge, talents, etc.. Because of them we can consider ourselves better than others and more important than them. God sees the things differently.

Only what we have given to others is our true richness. Only those talents that we dedicated to the service of others create the beauty of our lives. Only love guides us towards the union with eternal love who is God.
