(By Francesco & Raffaela Meffe) - And he said to him "Truly, I say to you, today you will be with me in Paradise." Luke 23:43.

Everybody in these days is getting ready for Christmas, preparing the great Christmas dinner. To succeed in our preparation we need to have in mind various things. When finally all is nearly ready, all we need is the final touch: a flower on the table, a wish card under the napkin, a leaf of lettuce under shrimps... Some small things, which create the atmosphere of the moment, hospitality, beauty and warmth.

And there we are... at the very end of the Advent. Christmas is almost here, at our doors. If indeed we have taken seriously this time of preparation, by now we must have understood that Jesus whom we wait for is not the chalk-baby from the crib, but it is the Son of God who comes. It was for Him that we have been preparing for.

We have gone into the desert to listen to John the Baptist. With his help we have renewed our hope in God who does not leave us alone, who has great plans for us, who sends us his only Son as his final word of mercy and love. Perhaps we have tried to overcome our weaknesses and to rich out from our egoism. Maybe we have already understood that to go to encounter Jesus means to encounter joy... All seems to be ready for the feast. All we still need is the final touch. The today's liturgy helps us in this. It gives us three precious tips.

Micah, in the first reading speaks about the small village where Jesus will be born: "You, Bethlehem too small to be among the clans of Judah, from you shall come forth for me one who is to be ruler in Israel." Who counts in the history of the men? The powerful ones, the rich ones, the men of success! Whom are the mass-media interested in? In celebrities, politicians, divas... They do not speak about the small, ordinary people, the poor ones, those who do not count. Bethlehem was the small village, perhaps the smallest in Judea. It could not compete with the neighbouring Jerusalem. Nevertheless God Bethlehem, not Jerusalem, for his Son's birthplace. It was also from here that David came from. And he was the last of the sons of Jesse... God does not watch the appearances, the externals, does not watch that what counts in the human eyes. God today needs you, not because you are better-off, but because you are a weak person, a sinner, not necessarily very wise. God does not know those who puff up themselves, who talk only to their equal. Also today Jesus in order to be born does not seek "the better family", the most beautiful house, the best decorated one... He seeks a family, which needs Him, the people who want him in their lives. For God is on the side of the little ones and his glory is revealed in answer to their needs. That's the first tip.

The letter to the Hebrews tells us about Jesus' readiness toward God the Father: "Behold, I come to do your will, O God." The Alleluia verse reports Mary's answer to the angel: "Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word". Every day, saying the Our Father, we repeat: "your will be done". To do the will of God means: to go wherever he wants, to trust and to

have hope in God. That's the second tip.

The third tip is suggested by Mary. After the annunciation, Mary to celebrate the joy of her motherhood, sets for a journey, not for tourism but for service. She doesn't keep the joy for herself. She wants to share it with others. Jesus comes for all. We learn from Mary to pass this gift to others. Jesus, the incarnate God, is the fruit of Mary's womb. Jesus is truly her Son. From her He received his body. In her he experienced his first human feelings. Thus from Mary we can learn the proper way to receive Jesus in our lives and to carry him to others. This proper way is believing. Elisabeth says to Mary: "Blessed are you who believed". Mary is the one who believed.

If you did this last touch suggested by today's readings: humility, obedience to God and readiness for service, it means that you are ready to celebrate Jesus' birth. He truly will be in your heart!
