#### "Ephphatha- Be Opened!"

My dear family in Christ,

"What are you, deaf?"

Growing up, especially as a teenager, this was a phrase I heard a lot from my loving parents. I was perhaps not the only young man who developed selective hearing when it came to the commands and prohibitions of my parents, particularly when it came to those I disagreed with. As it turns out, it wasn't so much a question of my capacity to *hear* my parents, as it was a matter of who and what I chose to *listen* to.

In our Gospel this Sunday, Jesus has an encounter with a man 'who was deaf and who had an impediment in his speech'. (Not to spoil the ending, but Jesus heals this man). It is a common but nonetheless interesting principle: what and how we hear directly impacts what and how we speak. When the man is healed (sorry to spoil the ending), not only are his ears opened, but 'his tongue was released, and he spoke plainly.'

How many of us do not hear God? Most of us aren't deaf, but perhaps we don't listen especially well. Perhaps we drown out the voice of God with the distractions of various media, a busy social calendar, or simply other voices that aren't His. Maybe we fail to go to the places where we would actually hear His voice, like scripture, prayer, adoration, or silence. As a result, it's no surprise that we find it difficult to speak with clarity and charity about Him when we get the opportunity. Perhaps we even shy away from these opportunities because deep down we are conscious of our 'deafness'. Today, Jesus invites us to change.

In the rite of Baptism for children, after the baptism itself the priest touches the ears and mouth of the newly baptized and says: "May the Lord Jesus, who made the deaf to hear and the mute to speak, grant that you may soon receive His Word with your ears, and profess the Faith with your lips, to the praise and glory of God the Father." If you've been baptized, this prayer has been prayed over you. The healing power of Jesus has been unleashed upon you in the same words as today's Gospel: "Ephphatha-Be Opened!"

So, are we deaf? Who are we listening to? Let us take care to listen more to God, and less to the noise around us. Let us allow God's healing grace to open our ears to Him, that we may speak His Truth, Love, and Mercy to our world which is desperate to hear Him.
