Today's readings deal with topics that we would rather avoid. The readings deal with sickness and death. We have such a hard time with these topics that we have created stories to tone down the reality. So, when a baby dies or a child, like the child in the Gospel, we say, "God must have wanted another angel with Him in heaven." This is not true. God doesn't go around killing babies and little children because his angel inventory is low. Let's face it, most of us cannot understand the very fact of death, so we put it all on God's shoulders. "It's God's will," we say when a person dies. No it isn't. To say that it is God's will is to say that God does evil things.

The author of the first reading, from the Book of Wisdom, a

book found in the Catholic Bibles, does not make this mistake. Not is he afraid to tell the truth. "God did not make death. Nor does He rejoice in the destruction of the living." He made everything wholesome



and good. He formed man to be imperishable, made in the image of His own nature. But through the envy of the devil, death entered into the world. This is something else we don't want to hear. Sickness and death are the result of sin. Most often this is not the result of the sins of the person who gets sick or dies, but it is due to the consequences of sin in the world.

So, is there hope for this world? Yes, there is hope. There is hope because Christ is in this world. We learned today how He healed that lady and how He raised up that child. We know that He alone has power over sickness and death.We hold on to Jesus Christ with all our might, because He alone makes sense of the confused reality of life. We ask the Lord to help us transform the world from its slavery to sin by giving us the courage to fight sin in our own lives.
